

Prelude

ORGANIZATION

Call to Order

Dr. Travis Collins, pastor of the host church, welcomed everyone and prayed.

Dr. Allen Hays, Moderator, called the 184th Annual Meeting into order.

Bro. Allen introduced Mrs. Denise Panter, Association Clerk. She moved that the registered messengers that are now present and those who may arrive later constitute the body of the 184th Annual Meeting of the Madison Baptist Association on Tuesday, October 12, 2021, at First Baptist Church, Huntsville, Alabama. The motion was seconded by Rev. Dana Workman and was approved.

Bro. Allen introduced Rev. Jarman Leatherwood, Vice-Moderator. He directed attention to the agenda in the packet for the afternoon. He then made a motion that the agenda be accepted as printed as the agenda for the 2021 Annual Meeting. The motion was seconded by Rev. Tim Payne and was approved.

Congregational Singing

Rev. Dana Workman, MBA Music Director, led the singing.

Special Music

Special music was performed by First Baptist Church of Huntsville instrumentalists.

Reports

Rev. Todd Panter, Team Leader of the Church Strengthening Ministry Team, gave his report. He listed areas where the team can assist the pastor and his church: retreats, connecting church and community, supplemental pay consideration for a staff member, outside resources (NAMB and state), and church strengthener teams.

Rev. Edwin Hocutt brought greetings from the Alabama State Board of Missions, including a video greeting from Dr. Rick Lance, Executive Director. Bro. Edwin stated that the state convention would be held at Whitesburg Baptist Church on November 16-17 and reviewed the ministries covered on the messenger envelopes. He concluded by introducing Rev. Chase Williams, the new campus pastor for Alabama A&M.

Rev. Frank Swalley, of Willowbrook Church, gave the New Works Committee report on page 27 of the Book of Reports. He made the recommendation that Mosaic City Church be accepted into full membership. The motion came with its own second and was approved. He then talked about Faith Fellowship working through the new plant process with ALSBOM. He encouraged churches to make church plant team. He concluded his report by sharing that The Gospel Center was withdrawing from watchcare.

Congregational Singing

Rev. Dana Workman led the congregation in song. He also introduced the pianist, Mr. Don Reeseaman.

Special Music

Special music was performed by Ms. Gena Roberts, Hillwood Baptist Church.

GENERAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

General Business

Dr. Allen Hays, Moderator and pastor of Wall Highway Baptist Church, Madison, began the general business session with the following presentation and reports.

Rev. Mylon Metcalf of Huntsville Park Baptist Church and the MBA Treasurer, called attention to the Financial Report on pages 57-66 in the Book of Reports. He reviewed the information about the past year's income and expenses. He also reviewed the proposed 2022 budget on pages 62-63 and noted that the new budget was \$3,300 lower than the current budget. He also noted that the staff had now not received raises for several years. He noted the church giving on pages 60-61. There were no questions. The report and the proposed budget were accepted as presented.

Rev. Benny Berry, pastor of Bevill's Chapel Baptist Church, and for the Nominating Team, asked the assembly to view the listing of people on the Budget/Stewardship, Personnel, and Trustees Committees, as notated on page 38 of the Book of Reports. It was the recommendation of the Nominating Team that these

people be accepted in the positions listed, provided there were no other nominations. Bro. Al asked if there were further nominations; there were not. The motion came with its own second and passed.

Dr. Gary Swafford of University Baptist Church, representing the Time and Place Team, referred to the Time and Place report on page 31 of the Book of Reports. He stated that we have accepted the invitation of Willowbrook Church (Bailey Cove campus) to host the 185th Annual Meeting on Tuesday, October 11, 2022. The 186th Annual Meeting on Tuesday, October 10, 2023 will be held at the Jackson Way Baptist Church, Huntsville. No questions were asked. The motion came with its own second and was approved.

Bro. Gary then gave the report for the 99 Club, as printed on page 29 of the Book of Reports. He spoke to the need of providing assistance to new church plants, especially in light of the fact that Huntsville is the largest city in the state and continues to grow. He asked that the assembly please read the report, giving specific attention to the testimonials highlighted in yellow in that report.

Election of Officers

Dr. Allen Hays, Moderator, noted that it was time to nominate and elect new officers. Rev. Bobby Gordon, GracePointe Baptist Church, came forward to make nominations, but gave a brief testimony for the 99 Club first. Bro. Bobby then recommended that our current general officers (Dr. Allen Hays as moderator, Rev. Jarman Leatherwood as vice-moderator, and Rev. Mylon Metcalf as treasurer), continue to serve a second term. Bro. Dana seconded the motion. There were no other nominations. The motion passed.

Director of Missions Report

Dr. Charlie Howell, Executive Director of Missions, came before the assembly to give his report, referring to pages 24-25 in the Book of Reports. He noted that we have 87 churches within the association and no churches under watchcare. He noted those churches that were without a senior pastor. He welcomed new church pastors and staff. Bro. Charlie shared that Dr. Charles Freeman had been extremely ill and asked for prayer on his behalf. He shared that covid had caused both the association and our churches to adapt and make adjustments. He talked about online services, live-stream, and drive-in services. He walked through the ministries that the association provides and supports. He also invited ministers and staff to the monthly ministers conferences on the first Thursday of the month.

Presentations

Dr. Howell requested that Dr. Allen Hays—Moderator, Rev. Jarman Leatherwood—Vice-Moderator, Rev. Mylon Metcalf—Treasurer, Denise Panter—Clerk, and Rev. Dana Workman, Association Music Ministry Director, come up to be recognized for their excellent work in 2020-2021—and Bro. Dana for sixteen years of hard work as the Music Minister Director—and each of them was given a gift card in appreciation.

Congregational Singing

Rev. Dana Workman led the congregation in song.

MBA Missions Report

Rev. Ron Lynch referred to his report on page 21, noting mission opportunity dates for 2022 and the news of a state partnership for Rocket City Missions, as well as a new missions trip to Alaska! He talked about the importance of VBS and shared that we

have a new VBS Director for the association, Ms. Pam Helton. He continued to go through the list of opportunities the MBA provides for churches to be “on mission,” including Romania, Love Packages, Special Olympics, and more. Bro. Ron then invited Mrs. Barbara Glenn to the platform to recognize and thank her for eleven years of service with the Madison Baptist Association, serving as the association’s “Mission Mobilizer” and gifted her with a token of appreciation. He further explained that while Barbara was retiring, but had agreed to help with Romania and Rocket City Missions. Ron concluded by saying how amazing it was, the things we could accomplish when we worked together.

Special Music

Special music was performed by Cynthia Futrell (soloist), accompanied Esther Kim (pianist) from First Baptist Church of Huntsville.

Sermon

Dr. Joel Carwile, senior pastor at First Baptist Church, Athens, delivered the message, *Wait upon the LORD* from Acts 7:20-31.

Closing

Dr. Allen Hays, Moderator, made closing remarks and expressed his appreciation to First Baptist Church, Huntsville for hosting. Dr. Al Pihringer, Harvest Baptist Church, made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Mrs. Agnes Davis, All Nations Church, seconded the motion, which was approved.

MADISON BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

MONDAY, JANUARY 31, 2022

***Note: This meeting was recorded & live-streamed.**

Dr. Allen Hays called the meeting to order. Rev. Jay Hartsfield, Missions Pastor at Rivertree Church, gave a word of devotion and opened the meeting in prayer. There were approximately 25 in attendance. The meeting was also live-streamed to the MBA's Facebook page.

Attention was called to the August 2021 Executive Board meeting minutes. Ms. Wilma Sanders of Westlawn Baptist made the motion to accept the minutes as written. Rev. Tim Payne of Wears Chapel Baptist seconded the motion. There were no questions, additions or corrections and the motion was approved. Bro. Allen then called attention to the October 2021 Annual Meeting minutes. Mr. Eddie Landers of Willowbrook Church, made the motion to accept the minutes as written. Dr. Willie Hinton of West Mastin Lake Baptist seconded the motion. There were no questions, additions or corrections and the motion was approved.

Rev. Benny Berry for the Nominating Team came forward to present nominations. Rev. Mylon Metcalf has moved to a church out of the association and needs to be replaced. The Nominating Team motioned that Rev. Tim Payne be nominated to replace Bro. Mylan on the Budget/Stewardship Committee. The floor was opened up for questions and additional nominations. There were none. The motion was approved. The motion was then made to make Rev. Tim Payne treasurer. That motion was seconded by Dr. Willie Hinton. The motion was approved. The Nominating Team then nominated to replace Bro. Mylon on the Nominating Team with Mr. Gary Clayton of Cove Baptist. There were several procedural questions which were answered. The motion was approved.

Rev. Tim Payne came to present the Budget/Stewardship report. First, he called attention to the various printed reports in Executive Board packet. He reviewed the quarterly financials. He noted that \$40,000 was transferred from budget reserve to the Association's operating account. There was a question about the \$40,000 transfer. Dr. Charlie Howell asked to speak to the transfer. He explained that the operating account was short and that he had talked to Bro. Mylon (before he left), and they agreed to transfer the \$40,000 to cover the deficit. Bro. Tim noted the church giving for 2021. He encouraged churches to continue to partner with the Association. Bro. Willie asked if anything was being done to reach out to those churches that were not giving at all. Bro. Charlie spoke to that and stated that there was not an organized plan to reach out to these churches. The report came as its own motion and was approved. (Complete report on file.)

Dr. Charlie Howell, Executive Director of Missions, came forward and gave his report. He shared that we have 87 churches in the association and none in watch care at this time. He also shared that there were six churches without a pastor, and only one of those churches had an interim pastor in place. Bro. Charlie noted that the New Works team was working with two potential plants: Faith Fellowship and Mill City. He shared how much he enjoyed visiting around the association churches, and said he was available to preach, as well. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Ron Lynch gave the Church & Community Ministry Director's report and referred to his written report. Bro. Ron went through the list of mission and training opportunities for the 2022 year, including Romania in April, Rocket City in May/June, and Alaska in July. He noted that Pam Helton was the association's VBS Director for this year and that she was putting together training for that. Specifically the Jump Start meeting in March for pastors and directors, which is not curriculum specific, and the April clinic for all rotations for the Spark curriculum. Association Bible Drills would be held at Whitesburg on

April 12, and it was open to all churches. Pastor Connect is still happening for young pastors/church plants/pastors without a full staff – meeting most months at the BCM; it's a good networking, discussion time. Bro. Ron stated he was happy to help churches in any way he could – just to give him a call. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Todd Panter, Camp MACOBA Camp Host, came forward to share that work on the bathhouse project was about 85% complete. He shared that he would be calling the plumber soon. He also noted that a work day was scheduled for Saturday, February 26. (Written report on file.)

Bro. Todd then spoke as team leader of the Church Strengthening Team. He explained the name change from Church Revitalization Team to Church Strengthening Team. He also gave a summary of what the team was working on, including preparations for the 2022 Pastor/Wife Appreciation Weekend.

Rev. Chase Williams, Campus Minister of Alabama A&M, came forward and shared that things on campus are going well. He noted that 2021 (his first year at A&M) was all about legwork, but 2022 was in person. Bro. Chase shared that they had 30+ students attend the meeting held on January 30 – and most of them found out are “seekers” and found out through social media. They've got twenty students signed up for Pursuit and in March, they will be heading to Harlem to help a church planter. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Edwin Hocutt, Campus Minister of UAH and Calhoun, Huntsville came forward to share his report. They've got a lot of activities going on. UAH approved (at the last minute) all of their WOW activities for the winter/spring semester. In February, he's showing *Show Me the Father* at the BCM for pastors and church leaders. Then on February 12, he's showing it on campus, free to all students. On March 5, they will hold the annual rummage sale. They are currently accepting donations for the sale, and all proceeds go to fund collegiate missions. On March 12-17, they will be headed to Gulfport for spring break missions. (Written report on file.)

Mr. Jack Fuson, Disaster Relief Coordinator, gave the DR report. Bro. Jack referred to his report in the packet, and noted that between May and December, DR had accumulated 2,000+ volunteer hours. He spoke about the certification/training that was held in October. He shared about deployments to Louisiana. He talked about collecting totes, cleaning supplies, and drinks, and how those totes were actually used for people to collect and save their belongings. He shared that two chaplains were sent to Mayfield, Kentucky after the tornadoes there, with \$7,000 in cash and gift cards, to be distributed to those with need. He also talked about the budget and how Disaster Relief is mainly funded by designated funds. He concluded by sharing that Whitesburg was allowing them access to their “garage” and that maintenance to the DR trailers and vehicles would take place there on February 19th. (Written report on file.)

There was no old business, new business, nor announcements.

Dr. Willie Hinton moved to adjourn the executive board meeting and Rev. Tim Payne seconded the motion, which was approved. Bro. Allen closed in prayer with Matthew 9:8.

**MADISON BAPTIST ASSOCIATION
EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING
MONDAY, APRIL 25, 2022**

***Note: This meeting was recorded & live-streamed.**

Dr. Allen Hays called the meeting to order. Rev. Terrell Boyd gave a word of devotion and opened the meeting in prayer. There were approximately 18 in attendance. The meeting was also live-streamed to the MBA's Facebook page.

Attention was called to the January 2022 Executive Board meeting minutes. Dr. Al Pihringer made the motion to accept the minutes as written. Mr. Eddie Landers seconded the motion. There were no questions, additions or corrections and the motion was approved.

Rev. Tim Payne came to present the Budget/Stewardship report. First, he called attention to the various printed reports in Executive Board packet. He reviewed the quarterly financials, the year-to-date giving, and noted a roughly \$10,000 deficit between income and expenses. Dr. Kevin Moore asked when the deficit started and was there a plan to do something about it. Dr. Charlie Howell asked to speak to that and responded the finances had actually been in decline for several years, with bare-bones budgets in place. There was discussion about things that could/should be done to prevent further decline, including contacting churches and sharing the importance and significance of the association with them. Bro. Kevin then asked what would be the process for moving money from the budget reserve to cover operating costs. Bro. Tim responded that such a transfer would need to go before the Budget/Stewardship Committee, and they would vote on it. The report came as its own motion and was approved. (Complete report on file.)

Dr. Charlie Howell, Executive Director of Missions, came forward and gave his report, referring to the printed copy in the packet. Bro. Charlie walked through the purpose and activities of the association. He talked about the Evangelism and Prayer team, the Church Strengthening team, and the New Works team. He shared that the association is working with two new church plants, Mill City Church and Faith Fellowship Baptist Church, both of which are working through the ALSBOM approval process to be admitted into association watchcare in the fall. Bro. Charlie shared the churches that are currently without pastors and asked that prayer be lifted on their behalf. He then discussed current and upcoming mission opportunities. He concluded with an invitation to attend the Pastors Fish Fry on May 3 at Camp MACOBA, as well as the next Minister's Conference on June 2. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Edwin Hocutt, Campus Minister of UAH and Calhoun, Huntsville, gave his report, referring to the written reports. He first spoke on behalf of Rev. Chase Williams (not present) and Alabama A&M BCM. He shared they were able to do an Easter service on campus and an Easter egg hunt. Bro. Chase had three students get involved with local churches, and five students saved. They are planning a spring trip to New York, and one student is possible going back over the summer. Bro. Edwin then shared that Calhoun Huntsville was going well. They are having new people showing up frequently to meetings. They had training at Shocco for students preparing for OneMissionStudent summer. Two students from UAH will be serving in Southeast Asia, and a student from Calhoun Huntsville will be serving in Rochester, New York for the summer. He shared that Calhoun would be breaking for the summer, but they would have a couple of fun activities over the summer to keep students together. UAH BCM was able to go to Gulfport over spring break and worked on a house there, and worked with four different churches. They made over \$1,200 on the March rummage sale

and \$1,300 on the pie auction. Their Tuesday meeting has a time change to 8 p.m. First Tuesday, which is a fellowship time, will continue through the summer. New leadership is in place for the fall, as are the activities for WOW. (Written report on file.)

Mr. Eddie Landers, Disaster Relief team member, gave the DR report for Mr. Jack Fuson. He referred to the printed report. Bro. Eddie asked for prayer for both Jack and Dr. Carl. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Terrell Boyd, Evangelism and Prayer team leader, gave the report for his team. He shared that the state convention is running a program called *The Gospel to Everyone*. This is a multi-year campaign and the MBA (through its churches) is responsible for reaching every home in Madison County. Churches work together by zip code to reach their “zip” area. Packets are provided free of charge by the state. Bro. Terrell also talked about prayer and having groups of twelve churches praying together and for each other. He has the first group going and anyone interested in joining should contact him.

There was no old business or new business.

Announcements: Two churches are needed to feed Campers on Mission volunteers. See Denise for more information. Deadline to sign up for the Alaska mission trip is May 2. Sign-up is open for anyone interested in playing in the MBA Golf Tournament. The Camp MACOBA fish fry is May 3 at 11:30. Everyone is welcome.

Bro. Allen closed with a thought from his morning devotional: a loveless Christian hinders the Gospel; we need to love each other and the lost!

Bro. Kevin moved to adjourn the executive board meeting; Bro. Tim seconded the motion, which was approved. Bro. Allen closed in prayer.

**MADISON BAPTIST ASSOCIATION
EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING
MONDAY, AUGUST 29, 2022**

***Note: This meeting was recorded & live-streamed.**

Dr. Allen Hays called the meeting to order. Rev. Benny Berry gave a word of devotion and opened the meeting in prayer. There were approximately thirty people in attendance. The meeting was also live-streamed to the MBA's Facebook page.

Attention was called to the April 2022 Executive Board meeting minutes. Bro. Benny Berry made the motion to accept the minutes as written. Rev. Tim Payne seconded the motion. There were no questions, additions or corrections and the motion was approved.

Rev. Tim Payne came to present the Budget/Stewardship report. First, he called attention to the various printed reports in Executive Board packet. He reviewed the quarterly financials and the year-to-date giving. There was a question from Dr. Kevin Moore regarding the quarterly loss. Dr. Charlie Howell responded that a one-time gift from Highlands Baptist Church (which was dissolving) had been deposited. Bro. Kevin followed up by asking what would happen if the funds in the Budget Reserve account were all used. Bro. Tim responded that the loan fund could possibly be dissolved. The report came as its own motion and was approved.

Bro. Tim then presented the proposed budget for 2023 to be presented at the October annual meeting and reviewed the line items. The budget came as its own motion and was approved. (Complete financial report on file.)

Dr. Charlie Howell, Executive Director of Missions, came forward and gave his report, referring to the written report in the packet. He shared that the New Works team is meeting regularly, and that there are two church plants in the approval process with the state. He talked about the DLife bootcamp conference that had taken place the prior weekend. He then recounted the churches without pastors. Bro. Charlie spoke about "The Gospel To Everyone" program and said fourteen churches were participating. He shared that Will Harbison would be the speaker for the Minister's Conference on September 8. He closed by referring to the attend the annual meeting on October 11 at Willowbrook Church. He stated that the theme of the meeting would be "Not Ashamed" and that Dr. Daniel Wilson, State Missionary and Director of the Evangelism Office, would be the featured speaker. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Ron Lynch, Minister of Church & Community Ministries, came forward and gave his report by sharing highlights and pictures from events that had taken place since the last meeting. He'd met with two Gideon camps, sharing about the mission trip to Romania/Ukraine. Had enjoyed the DLife bootcamp conference, stating that it was a great program, built on multiplication. He'd been to VBSs all around the association. He shared that Rocket City Missions had partnered with YMlink and blessed nine families in the Huntsville area this summer. Bro. Ron also shared that Pastor Liviu will be speaking at the annual meeting, and talked about the 2023 Romania mission trip. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Chase Williams Campus Minister of Alabama A&M, came forward and gave his report. He first thanked all the churches for their support. He shared that the first three weeks of school had been crazy, but that they reached over 250 students with physical surveys. Bro. Chase asked for prayer for the more than 75% of those students surveyed, who indicated they were looking for a local church to join. He shared that Bible study would be starting in a week, and that "worship services" would begin the following week, partnering with the UAH BCM. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Edwin Hocutt, Campus Minister of UAH and Calhoun, Huntsville, came forward to give his report. He shared that their Celebration event continued over the summer, which was good for continuity. He also shared that they

had several students participate with Rocket City Missions, though not as many as they had in years past, due to the change of the dates. He talked about the three students who went through the Nehemiah team training and then went to Rochester, NY (one student), and SE Asia (two students), to serve for the summer. He talked about several events held over the summer (referring to pictures in his written report) and shared that the Bob Ross paint night they held, which was open to all campus students, was a huge success. They passed out 148 canvasses and were able to share the Gospel. Bro. Edwin thanked everyone for their support. (Written report on file.)

Rev. Todd Panter, Camp MACOBA Host and Church Strengthening Team Leader, came forward and gave his report. He referred to his written report and shared about the progress on the bathhouse and the tentative completion date of late September. (Written report on file.)

Bro. Todd then went on to share about the upcoming events, sponsored by the Church Strengthening team. The first was the Ministry Fair on October 25, from 8-4, at FBC Huntsville. The second was the Pastor Encouragement Dinner, set for January 27-28. Dr. Ronald Meeks would be the speaker. The third would be a podcast “Meet the Pastor” series, starting in the late fall/early winter.

Dr. Edwin Jenkins said that Mount Zion was the host site for the 2022 Singin’ event on Tuesday, September 20, and invited all to attend. Bro. Allen pointed out that there were several flyers attached to the report packet that should be looked at, including the Christmas Backpacks drive.

Dr. Kevin Moore moved to adjourn the executive board meeting; Mr. Barry Hillis seconded the motion, which was approved. Bro. Ron closed in prayer.

Church Strengthening Team

For those who are not familiar with the Church Strengthening Team, our goal is to determine what our Pastors and Churches need to carry out their mission, and do what we can to assist you. The purpose of this letter is to make you aware of some of the ways we offer assistance, and give you a heads up on a few upcoming events we believe will be a blessing to you.

Church Partnerships: We are constantly seeking to help churches partner with one another for various reasons. It could be that a particular church has declined to a certain number and there is a new church plant looking for a facility (we have played a part in several of these in the last few years). Another reason could be that one church may not have enough workers for VBS, a Block Party, or other mission projects and another church is willing to send some of their people to help. It could be that one church needs some renovation and another can send workers. There are so many possibilities.

Club 180: This is a fund we created to help churches that need certain ministry positions but cannot afford to pay enough to hire a staff person. When completely funded, and with approval, we can supplement the pay of a staff member for a limited amount, up to one year. We believe this can give small churches a better opportunity to fill staff positions.

Connecting Church and Community: We have members of the team who are familiar with connecting churches with their community through homeschool, or the Lunches of Love ministry, which can help connect the church and a nearby school.

Church Health Review: We have members of this team who have led churches through the review to help them discover where their weaknesses are and how to overcome them.

Missionaries: We have several missionary couples who will come and spend time in a church to help strengthen them and serve. We are constantly seeking more missionaries of this nature.

Discovery Class: We have members on the team who are certified PLACE Ministry coaches. PLACE is a group of assessments which help church members discover where they are best gifted for ministry, based on personality, spiritual gifting, abilities, passion and more. Next class coming in 2023.

Multiple Training: Several of our team members have experience in training your leadership—Deacons, Group Leaders, VBS Directors, etc.

Video/Podcast: *One Church: Connected* The initial series will be entitled “Meet the Pastor”. In this first series, the host and co-host will spend time in casual conversation with a pastor to show his human side. The purpose is to give the Pastor an opportunity to present the church he leads in a positive light, what they do well, and to allow those watching a peek into his life outside the ministry....to hear his story. There will be no doctrine discussed or controversial subjects. Every Pastor interviewed will receive questions well in advance to think about his answers if he chooses.

This is certainly not an exhaustive list, but it can give you an idea of what is available. We are not a passive team, but active and take this role seriously. Welcome to the 185th Annual Meeting of the Madison Baptist Association! The theme for today's meeting is "Not Ashamed" – Mark 8:38; Romans 1:16. In today's adulterous and sinful generation, Christians are not to be ashamed of Jesus Christ or the Word of God. We are delighted to have Dr. Daniel Wilson with us today to preach on this theme. Daniel serves as the Director of the Office of Evangelism for our Alabama State Board of Missions. He has greatly assisted me as our Evangelism & Prayer Team recently implemented an evangelistic outreach ministry in our Association known as "The Gospel to Everyone." This outreach ministry, in conjunction with the Saturate USA movement, involves believers going door-to-door throughout America delivering the Jesus Film (DVD), a gospel tract, and any other material each individual church wants to include. The primary purpose is to share the good news of Jesus Christ with all of America. Our Association of churches is privileged to do its part by delivering these materials to the homes that are closest to the church that we attend. There is also the possibility of talking to people about the Lord at the front door when the materials are being delivered. The good thing about this effort is that there is no timetable for when it is to be completed, so your church can still get involved if it wants to. We currently have 14 MBA churches involved, attempting to deliver an astounding 24,168 sets of materials. Please contact Dr. Daniel Wilson at ALSBOM (334-613-2245) if your church desires to be a part of "The Gospel to Everyone" here in the Huntsville area.

We currently have 87 member churches in the Madison Baptist Association with 2 new churches coming under the watch care of the Association today. These churches are Faith Fellowship Baptist Church (Tony Fleming, pastor) and Mill City Church (Will Harbison, pastor). The following churches are currently without pastors: Bethany, Bethlehem (Lacey's Spring), Cave Spring, First Flint River, First Meridianville, Hillwood, Huntsville Park, Mable Hill, Mt. Olive, The Bridge at Moore's Mill, and Westlawn.

The goal of the Madison Baptist Association is to "assist churches in fulfilling their mission, and provide them opportunities for fellowship and to work together in advancing the kingdom of God." This is primarily achieved through a "Team Approach" to ministry. For example, our New Works Team is involved in assisting church planters who are planting SBC churches in the Huntsville area. This Team works closely with ALSBOM to insure that the church planters are adequately trained and equipped to be successful in their efforts. The Evangelism & Prayer Team plans and promotes evangelism and prayer efforts throughout our Association. "The Gospel to Everyone" is one example of their efforts, along with the various Prayer Seminars that have been held in our Association over the years. The Church Strengthening Team focuses on church revitalization in our Association. Last year's Pastor & Spouse Retreat, along with the continual work of "church strengtheners" serving in various MBA churches are two examples of the work this Team does. The upcoming "Ministry Fair" (October 25 @ FBC Huntsville) is another event this Team has planned to benefit our churches. As you attend today's Annual Meeting and read through the Book of Reports you will learn more about the many good things our Association of Churches is involved in such as Disaster Relief, missions, campus ministry, and camp ministry.

As most people are well-aware, our Association has struggled financially over the last few years. I don't know how else to fix the problem except to ask all of our 89 churches to give sacrificially to the ministry of the Association to which they belong. Our MBA Guiding Documents states the following: "Each church is encouraged to give a minimum of 3% - 5% of its undesignated receipts toward the support of Associational missions." (p. 30) The churches that currently give 3% or more to the Association are few and far between. I believe if each of our churches gave at least 2% of their undesignated money to support the MBA budget we would have more than enough money to fund our budget rather than be constantly running in the red. I hate to see missions, church planting, and other ministries adversely affected by the lack of funding. I believe the local Association is the "glue" that binds/connects the local SBC churches as a family, rather than them functioning as a group of "independent" churches that rarely do ministry together or have fellowship together. The Association receives no Cooperative Program Funds nor do we have fundraisers to support our budget. We are totally dependent on the donations of our churches to stay afloat.

It has truly been a privilege to serve as your Executive Director of Missions for the last 10 years. I hope the MBA will grow stronger and move ahead in its ministry for the Lord in the days ahead. "The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you. My love be with you all in Christ Jesus. Amen." (I Cor. 16:23-24)

Our mission as churches is to win souls for our Lord, to defeat the schemes of the devil as he pulls them away and attempts to derail our efforts.

Our mission as your Evangelism and Prayer Team is to foster cooperation between churches as you pursue your mission, and to enable and equip your church in every way possible.

In evangelism this year, our main focus has been through a partnership with the Alabama State Board of Missions and “Saturate USA.” The multi-year vision is to place a DVD titled, “The Life of Jesus” and other material on the door of every home in Madison County.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

More and more these days we hear less the term “Sunday School” and more of “small groups”. As I have gotten older some things are less important; I try and not sweat the small stuff. What a group is called is one of those things. The problem is with the name change, we also seem to have thrown out the principles that were connected to it. Now we have life groups and connect groups and all kind of other groups whose purpose seems to center more around social reasons than anything else. Oh, sometimes a small devotion is given and even the Bible opened, but less and less I find these groups connected to the *Church’s mission*. There is very little accountability and believe it or not often times a lack of ministry.

For years we have measured many things in our Baptist churches: attendance, baptisms, visitors, etc. and we still do. Really though, there is one metric that should be measured above everything else: “Life Change”. This occurs at salvation and should constantly be happening through discipleship. It can be measured, evaluated, and tracked....and should be. With the proper leaders in a Sunday School class (which is key), it used to happen this way. The Preacher would bring a word from God on Sunday and the Holy Spirit moved in the hearts of the people. Or it might also come from when the class leader taught a lesson from the Bible. They would be convicted that they needed to do something or make some kind of change in their life. They would share this in class or privately with their leader. He/she would then help them with the practical aspects of spiritual growth.

As Teachers gain experience they learn not to just teach lessons, but to teach to needs.....of their people. A teacher has to know their members well to do this. This is critical to life change. There are some churches that have come on the scene in the last decade that have exploded in their attendance. I can’t say what God is or isn’t doing in them, but if life change is not taking place in those who attend ... then they may be doing many good things but missing the *main* thing.
